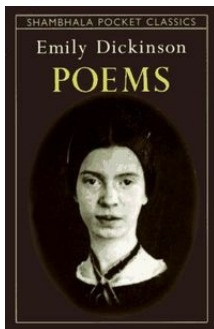


POEMS
