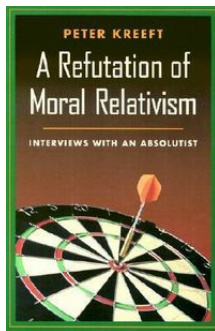


A REFUTATION OF MORAL RELATIVISM: INTERVIEWS WITH AN ABSOLUTIST
