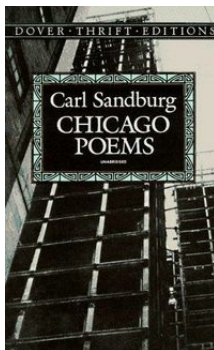


CHICAGO POEMS
